#### **Motor Development in the Infant and Child**

major types of skills: gross motor, fine motor, language and social skills Gross motor skills require the use of large muscles to achieve sitting, crawling and walking in the first year of life Fine motor skills involve the use of small muscles in the hands and fingers, in tasks such as picking up small objects, and later for feeding and dressing
